BRIEF RESEARCH BIO

My research is focused on issues of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) and Corporate Social Investment (CSI) in developing countries and emerging economies. In addition, I examine questions of entrepreneurship, including economic empowerment in developed and developing countries. Other areas in which I research include commodity agreements, such as the EU/ACP Sugar Protocol, the EU's Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) and subsidiarity questions, the impact of EU aid programmes on developing countries; and development of crafts for exports, particularly with reference to the European Union and African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries. I have also worked on issues on development, including globalisation, global (financial) crises, structural adjustment policies, foreign direct investment (FDIs), Intensive Alternatives to Custody (U.K.), food 'crisis', sustainable development and service delivery, decent work and livelihoods strategies. I also examine theoretical Marxian and Keynesian/neo-Ricardian issues.
